

WASP COMMUNITY BUS

The new Mercedes Sprinter Bus continues to attract favourable comment from both passengers and drivers as it provides a useful service to the local villages. Currently the regular twice monthly runs are from Holmbury St Mary via Forest Green to Tesco in Broadbridge Heath (on a Tuesday afternoon), to Sainsbury's at Godalming from Abinger, Gomshall, Peaslake and Shere (on a Thursday morning) and to Cranleigh (on a Saturday morning) with pick ups in Abinger, Gomshall and Peaslake . We also offer a quick visit to the Library in Shere on a Monday afternoon (generally from Peaslake). Most pick ups are from bus shelters but we do offer a 'door to door' service where this is requested, we try to be as flexible as is practical.

Recent longer runs have included a number of trips into Kent for the Guildford Ramblers and visits to the Amberley Museum, to the Brick Lane Theatre in London, to the Chelsea Royal Hospital and to the National Trust property, Rainham Hall, in Rainham, Essex. In between these the Shere Good Companions use us for their monthly lunch outings. Coming up are two visits to the Christmas Market in Winchester.



NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

You've heard of workouts with dumbbells, now try church bells!



Bells are the largest and loudest instrument in the world. They are also the perfect way to get gentle physical exercise and increase active living for people who are looking for alternatives to conventional sport.

Ringing is open to everyone, young and old, and with any level of existing fitness. Whilst bells can weigh up to 4,500kg most are much lighter and are rung using mainly technique rather than strength. The movement of bell ringing often helps many people to stay active longer and increase agility.

Research commissioned by The Churches Conservation Trust asked experts from fitness and training provider YMCAfit to observe the process of bell ringing. They found that bell ringing improves agility, co-ordination, reaction time, balance, muscle endurance and cardiovascular fitness.

Pulling a rope may look like hard work, but actually it's more about having good rhythm. You can improve your agility, co-ordination, and reaction time, by achieving the perfect rope pull. Stretching up tones core abdominal muscles and glutes for a tight stomach and pert bottom, and the downwards rope-pulling action improves your upper body strength whilst working biceps, quads and calves with minimal force.

The study also identified that as a gentle and inherently sociable pastime, bell-ringing was an ideal 'gateway' to improved fitness and healthy living. Bell ringing requires you to think and use your memory, which is great for keeping the mind as well as the body active. And the fact it's a social activity means it's an ideal way for everyone to feel part of a group and embedded in their own communities.

32 years and 31 bonfire nights, never had a problem before but that all changed on the 2nd November 2019.

At 8am, the sky was clear as we started the marquee erection. By 9am, the rains were heavy and the winds were gusting hard. The marquee wobbled, the guy ropes strained and the field was so water logged that the centre support poles were slowly sinking. We were worried, what would happen if the gale continued? What if a gust ripped it away in the evening, with you good folk inside with the BBOs alight?

Mobile phones were consulted. Satellite imagery declared that the eye of the storm had yet to reach Ockley. The radio dispensed sombre talk of Amber Weather Alerts. Bonfire and firework organisers were urged to abandon plans. We huddled, wet and miserable and decided to delay further set up and to make a definitive decision at 11am.

The sides of the marquee danced a dervish, we took them down to preserve stability. We huddled together, hoping that bonhomie and a positive attitude would get us through this tiny set back. The clock marched on, relentlessly towards the decision hour of 11am. The wind rocked on too, the marquee wobbled, the side posts started to fall out as the canvas reared upwards like some gigantic sail. We looked at our watches, we looked at each other, it was only 10am but there seemed little point in delaying the inevitable. We took a deep breath and ... "bonfire night was postponed". We took the marquee down and cleared the field. The winds died a bit in the afternoon, mocking us for our caution, but the rain returned with nightfall and the winds gusted, local news bulletins reported that we were not alone as many other organisers, although not all, had abandoned the evening.

We pondered delaying it a mere week but the forecast for the following week was just as wet, as indeed it turned out to be. The field was sodden, to invite the public would be asking for slips, slides and misery. We considered an event in January, perhaps a rather special Ockley Burns Night? But in the end, our inability to guarantee a nice crisp dry night, and the unknown factor of getting sufficient folk out, because we would still need to charge to cover our costs, made us decide to cancel altogether, keep the display pieces for another year and keep our fingers crossed that storms like these really do only come along once every 32 years.

Sorry to all our supporters, but the risks to your safety and comfort were too great.

I love Van Gogh's painting 'Starry Night'! As I look and think about it I can hear Don McLean's haunting lyrics of 'Vincent (Starry, Starry Night)', written about the artist's life and struggles with mental illness and his struggle and passion as a painter. Apparently he only sold one painting in his lifetime. Simply amazing that now he is hailed as one of the most important post-impressionist painters! The painting was inspired by the view from his asylum room whilst recovering from a breakdown. Amazing too that during his time there he produced some of his most important paintings. We have a good view of the sky out here in our dark villages sometimes don't we? When you look up at the sky on a clear night and truly see the heavens they are inspiring aren't they. In fact Vincent Van Gogh is quoted as saying: 'When I have a terrible need of - shall I say the word - religion. Then I go out and paint the stars'. I like it!




