NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

More Virtual Bellringing

At the time of writing there is still no bellringing allowed in this country and no suggestion of when the restrictions will be lifted. There are concerns with



the proximity of ringers whilst ringing, contact with the rope and the facilities available in churches to allow for handwashing and sanitizing of ropes and anything else touched in gaining access to the ringing area. There are plans for a major campaign called Ringing Returns when ringing resumes, which it is hoped will have a similar impact to that for Ringing Remembers. Obviously it is difficult to make plans without a date!


We have continued to hold virtual practices every week on Zoom, allowing us to keep in touch with members of the bands at Ockley, Newdigate and Capel. A new resource was created at the beginning of lockdown by ringers in America called Ringing Room, and is still being improved on. It allows any user to create a tower and each ringer logged in can be assigned a bell number to ring by tapping a key or clicking on their rope icon. The chimes that are heard come from a recording of the Dorking bells. In fact it was part of a feature on BBC news recently looking at how the Southwark Cathedral ringers were coping during lockdown. Their virtual practice was very similar to our own experience. The use of Ringing Room allows us to practice some ringing albeit without the physical effort and enjoyment, or the aid of ropesight in seeing the other ringers. We have found it very useful in listening and counting our place in the round which should hopefully be of benefit when we ring for real once again as well as playing tunes for fun.

There are a number of resources available online and in particular, the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers has put together an index of YouTube videos (cccbr.org.uk/news/). This includes the news item mentioned above as well as an item by Josh Partridge in the Miscellaneous section which may also be of interest to a non-ringer. He demonstrates ringing a bell up (and down again) while a camera in the belfry simultaneously shows the effect of his actions on the bell. The rest of the videos are mainly tutorials in using ringing software, webinars from the Association of Ringing Teachers (ART) and training videos from a number of ringing associations. The Ringing World, a weekly magazine for ringers, has introduced a number of puzzles to keep their readers amused. A popular one is Methodku which has a grid with missing numbers to fill in and the solution is a diagram of part of a method. The main criteria are that in each row the number of each bell must appear once and only once, and that, as in normal method ringing, there are no jump changes, so numbers can only move forward or back one place per row. An easy example on four bells is reproduced here to demonstrate, with the added proviso for this solution that there are no more than 2 blows in one place. This means that reading it vertically no number can appear more than twice consecutively in a column. It should be possible for non-ringers to solve as the solution does not require knowledge of any method ringing:

IT'S AN ILL WIND THAT BLOWS NO GOOD

This can be said of the advent of the coronorvirus pandemic as such required those collecting prescriptions to be lined up outside respecting the authorised spacing. In such situations one has the opportunity to make an inspection of the building above normal eyelevel.

Such was the case on one sunny morning for none present, myself included, had ever noticed the presence of large public clock but what is more important to me was there is a weathervane. Weathervanes tell stories, cycle down to Devon and many depict destroyers or frigates, cycle up the east coast and it is trawlers and drifters. All of course unseen from a car.

Of the surgery weathervane, it is actually my silhouette of a blacksmith hitting a piece of iron bar as if he is angry (watch television presenters using a hammer and usually they pat a nail or piece of metal rather than strike). I can positively identify the silhouette, as the anvil is the very one purchased and used by a decorative smith making special items for Harrods and especially made for that purpose. It has two



bricks whereas the commercial anvil, of the so called 'London Pattern', has only one bick. The bick is the round and tapering pointed end.

The silhouette comes from a small text book called "Wrought Ironwork for the School Forge" which I wrote and was published by Macmillian in 1962, there was another book "Small Scale Aluminium Casting" published in 1959, Both books are much sought after today and secondhand copies sometimes come up on 'Amazon' priced at £20 to £50 according to condition. I had a request from a Professor at Manchester University asking if I had a spare copy as he was undertaking a university course for apprentices. I did not possess such but ran a special copy for such use from the original copy.

The weathervane on the Capel Surgery does no credit to the very high standards of care set by the staff at the surgery. The vane is what is known in the trade as 'suburban bent ironwork', the sort sold cheaply in garden centres for hanging baskets etc. Scrolls not properly tapered, having been bent cold around a piece of pipe with a slot cut in it to hold the end of the bar. Blacksmiths use special scroll tools after tapering the



ends, which can take many forms, are held when the metal bar is red hot, by a pair of side tongs, closing it on to the scroll tool aided by using blacksmith's long nose pliers made from a couple of old ten inch files, plus the specially made a blacksmith's wrench. (When proofreading the book for the publishers during publication the word wrench in the phrase, had been typeset as "two blacksmiths wenches".)

The silhouette features on many a blacksmith's forge as a weathervane countrywide, it is on a supermarket in Coventry, there have been a couple seen in America and another in Greece with the direction arms bearing the symbols for such in Greek. On one , when cycling the common distance for the


first day of a cycle tour, the hundred and ten miles from Forest Green to Dunmow via the Tilbury ferry, I passed through Dunton Green and noticed my silhouette on a vane on the local forge and went in for a chat. The blacksmith admitted that he had pinched the book out of the library when in the army doing national service, and that his mate used it up at the borstal. Interesting I thought. In a rather serious tone of voice I said, "There is such a thing as copyright". The answer was a gem, "What are school books for but to copy out of? I had to copy out pages and pages as a kid in school". Are things much different today regarding homework? We parted good friends, the forge has since closed, and the vane is no longer there, it is probably at his home.

I cannot remember how many vanes, village signs, and pub signs I have made but two stand out in the memory, the village sign at Abinger Hammer and a vane as a retirement present for a yachtsman. For that features the compass rose from the nautical charts, the cardinal buoyage system, and a distant silhouette of a yacht going the right way, passing the coastguard lookout with the



distinctive flags of the international code of signals WAY which translated, is 'bon voyage'.

The vane on our own house made sixty years ago is of the highwayman Mr Tibbet taken from the sign at Tibbets Conner on the A3, it is on the roundabout over the underpass, John Ogilby in his book of roads in 1566 describe this area as 'infested by robbers', and the reason it is on our house, it was where I first saw one of the few girls who commuted to London by cycle during the bombing in



1940. It was also the site of our parting two years later, she to nursing and me to the Royal Navy for service in HM destroyers, Bleasdale and Eskimo. It was to be another two years of silence before we met for our first date. That was by the kindness of the naval Surgeon Commander of Sherborne temporary naval hospital in Dorset, after three weeks sick leave and before returning to active service. At the interview he asked had I any questions, I answered yes Sir, I didn't finish digging the garden, as it was a hand injury involving amputations his reply was a surprise, "Three weeks more leave and make sure you damn well finish it!" At that time there was very little physiotherapy, did he realise the value of such? At no time would one say that sort of thing to an executive Commander. Even in wartime one would have been up before the captain in "Defaulters and Request Men" and possibly receive seven days loss of leave and pay.

Another local oddity:-

In the national cycle press the reason for this country not changing to metric measurement for road distances arose. The answer is to be found on a plate on the railway bridge at Ockley. There, it will be found the measurement from the London terminus of 29 miles 40 chains, on a cast iron plate taken from the original surveys of the 1830's. All those plates along with those marking the miles and quarter miles by the line-side countrywide, would have needed to be re cast. Each of the mileposts alone would cost at least £50 and not much less for the plates on every bridge. Not to mention the labour cost of removal and replacement, for a new pattern for each would be necessary to make the foundry sand mould, for the post, before casting it in iron. Such would need to be before the line-side post could be removed. Those posts are there for emergencies purposes namely location, should there be a crash or death of a worker checking or repairing the line.
