1. Switch on the defibrillator


 Remove or cut through clothing and wipe away sweat from the chest if necessary



MEMORIAL WINDOW IN ST MARGARET'S

A new Memorial Window has been installed in the north aisle of St. Margaret's next to the new exit door, designed by Amanda Blair of Abinger Stained Glass and installed by John Mahoney of Horsham.

The design is modern in vibrant colours in contrast to the other rather dark Victorian windows. It features a dominant cross, a dove at the top, a biblical quotation, 'I am the Resurrection and the Life' and a pastoral view, with a miniature Leith Hill tower at the top of the hill.

The initial design included Jayes and Elderslie and farm animals but was deemed too fussy. The window is in memory of Charles and Patience Lee Steere and John and Joan Prideaux, my parents and my uncle and aunt.

Charles was born and educated in Australia before going to Christ Church, Oxford. He inherited the Jayes estate because his second cousin, John, had been killed early in the First World War. John is commemorated in the chancel but is buried near Ypres in Belgium. John's parents, Harry and Anna, are commemorated by the choir stalls and his grandparents, Henry and Elizabeth, and his great grandparents Lee and Ann, in the other stained glass window in the north aisle. They are all buried in the family tomb at St Margaret's.

Charles served in the RAF and was killed flying over Belgium on 27th May 1940 and is buried there.

Patience Lee Steere née Hargreaves Brown was brought up at Broome Hall in Coldharbour and married my father on 15th February 1939 at St. Margaret's and lived most of her life at Jayes. She is buried in the family tomb.

John Prideaux inherited Elderslie from his mother, Marion Arbuthnot, who married his father, Walter Prideaux, in 1901. His great-grandparents, George and Maria Arbuthnot and great-great grandparents, George (who bought Elderslie in 1824) and Elizabeth are commemorated on plaques in the south wall of the nave. He and Joan, my mother's sister, lived at Jayes before moving to Elderslie. They married in St Michael's, Chester Square, in London and are buried in the St John's graveyard. John was on the Parochial Church Council (and the Parish Council) for many years as well as having a successful career as a banker in London.

Elizabeth Lee Steere 's parents had rented Elderslie in the 1840s and she met Henry and carved their initials on a windowpane inside a heart!

There is a family story that the Arbuthnots, Calverts and Lee Steeres dined together almost weekly, and on one occasion the coach overturned going home because the coachman had over imbibed, so after that they dined and stayed the night, though they only lived a couple of miles apart.

THE GARDEN IN JULY AND AUGUST

So far this year we seem to have had more than our fair share of rain. We

also seem to have had cold winds more than usual which has slowed everything down. Consequently many of our favourite plants such as the colourfully exuberant lupins, delphiniums, clematis, peonies, alliums, geraniums have been a bit later in showing. Now in July and August the mid summer plants take centre stage. Plants such as achillea, echinacea, verbena bonariensis, echinops, scabious, leucanthemum, fuchsia and of course, the wonderful varieties of phlox, later flowering clematis and dahlias.



By July many annuals should also be in full bloom with glorious hanging baskets and pots. Be sure to water regularly and give a liquid feed once a week, maybe designate Fridays as feeding Friday. Also keep deadheading to maintain the flowering of annuals such as zinnia, cosmos, antirrhinum and nicotiana. Various 'repeat flowering' roses will continue to bloom through to autumn if they're looked after (and watered!). Keep deadheading and feeding them, particularly if they're in pots. Later-planted sweet peas should still be looking good if you cut them regularly (to stop them setting seed). And this is also the time when pots and hanging baskets give that extra vibrancy to our outside spaces; the bright reds, lipstick pinks, corals and lilacs of pelargonium, begonia and verbena; the blousy petunias; those honey-scented nemesia; and the trailing colourful stems of lobelia, bacopa and fuchsia.

On the vegetable patch make sure you water on a regular basis, particularly your tomatoes, consistently feeding them once a week. Stop cordon tomatoes from growing too high by removing the main shoot. Look for the leaf that's above the fourth truss (set of developing fruit) and cut it off here. This should ensure that all the fruits ripen by the end of the season. Also remove some of the lower leaves, Bush tomatoes can be left to their own devices.

First early Potatoes should be ready to harvest soon along with Spinach, Peas and Beans, Carrots, Salads and spring planted Onion and Garlic. Consider sowing spring cabbage, leeks and brassicas for a winter supply. Summer prune gooseberries and redcurrants.

And finally... the Okewood Ockley and Forest Green Summer Fair is on Saturday 10th August. After a very successful fair last year we are hoping

for a bumper year this year. It is the most popular fair in the area and is well known for the traditional and friendly atmosphere. There's fun for all the family with music and Morris Dancing; Classic Cars; a Kids Zone; and craft demonstrations. Check out the plant stalls and the various vegetable exhibits in the Marquee. You might even be exhibiting your own fruit, veg or flowers yourself. 

ANOTHER TRIUMPH FROM OCKLEY DRAMATIC SOCIETY

Alan Hardy's production of the two act comedy Quizzers by Geoff Bamber closely observes some wonderfully portrayed characters and their relationships with one another.

ODS's production featured a talented team of actors, from husband and wife team Martyn and Katie Peters playing the quiz obsessed husband Keith and his wife Lorna who kept him in place; their daughter Alison and her girlfriend Nic played by Vee Hardy and Chloe Wellman, planning their life together; the artist and well-known danger to women, Ross, played

by Stephen Dallyn; Binny, a wacky London designer so well inhabited by Wendy Freeman; Stella, Nic's mum who has had so many husbands she's not sure exactly how many, portrayed by Tracey Hardy and Gary Herring playing an ex-con who managed to portray his character Rat as someone both in control through meditation and yet totally unpredictable.

So how did they do? This was the best of am-dram with convincing characters and stage presence, wonderful ad-libbing, and some great comedy moments – mostly intended! Stella's lovey-dovey phone message for her not yet divorced husband, was delivered with suitable insincerity. Keith's continually stressing to get 'in the zone' for the quiz reminded me of real people I have actually met, and Lorna's escape to find sanity in her 'temperature-controlled cultivation environment' was portrayed with generosity as she put up with her husband's quiz obsession. Delightfully, art met reality when she referred to Keith by his real name – but she handled it well! Alison and Nic were convincing as a couple planning their life together – focussing on the central place of their washing machine in their relationship. Binny was clearly delighted to fall for Ross's 'input' as he played the all too convincing roué, while Rat's portrayal of the ex-con was worryingly lifelike and seemed to suggest that the rest of the characters were naïve to trust him.

Mention should be made of the scenery and costumes: Keith's study was wonderfully un-cared for as befits a man who is no longer interested in his career and has become absorbed in quizzes to the exclusion of everything else. UPDATE FROM WIENERBERGER EWHURST BRICK AND TILEWORKS COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE

The recent community liaison committee (CLC) held on 6th June 2024 was attended by representatives from Surrey County Council, Ockley Parish Council, Abinger Parish Council, Ewhurst Parish Council, Okewood Hill Residents Association and company representatives from Wienerberger.

The Works Manager was happy to report that following an extended maintenance shutdown, the factory restarted on 1st May 2024. Production of bricks is slowly ramping up to capacity, when recent investments in new robotics and a kiln refurbishment should benefit production.

This follows several production challenges over the past 9 months, including a breakdown of the scrubber which failed 6 weeks prior to the factory shut down for maintenance in November. The scrubber is a piece of equipment that removes emissions from the kiln exhaust which is vented high to atmosphere via a chimney stack for dilution and dispersal. Over 200 tonnes of solidified limestone were removed from the scrubber as part of the repair

process. Now that repairs are complete and the scrubber is operational, a stack emissions test is planned for early July to confirm that the factory is compliant with the permit conditions for emissions to atmosphere. Mole Valley District Council has been kept up to date about the breakdown and schedule to return to normal operating conditions.

Wienerberger is keen to reduce its contribution to climate change and has already installed solar panels on the roof of its Visitor Centre. The company is now exploring the option to install ground mounted solar panels in its field behind the factory. The proposed scheme is a 1.4 MW system comprising 4,000 solar panels which could supply up to a quarter of the factory's electricity demand per year. This is well shielded by woodland and would only be visible from a footpath which runs along the site boundary. This will require planning approval and Wienerberger expects to submit a planning application to Surrey County Council later in 2024.

The factory continues to support local community groups and has recently supported visits for archaeologists, palaeontologists, Horsham Geological Society, as well as providing a training venue for the emergency services. Wienerberger continues to sponsor the children's classes at the Okewood, Ockley and Forest Green Flower Show. The factory will again hold a Heritage Open Day on 7th September 2024, please visit www.heritageopendays.org.uk to book your ticket.

Ewhurst brick and tileworks Community Liaison Committee (CLC) is a gathering of residents, councillors, council regulators and staff at Wienerberger. Members come together three times per year to discuss the interaction of the Ewhurst brick and tileworks operations with the local community. The discussions span a variety of issues and can include everything from supporting community groups and local events, to environmental monitoring and HGV traffic management in and around the factory. Members can recommend topics for the agenda according to their interests.

In between the CLC meetings, members are encouraged to share points of interest with their neighbours and the broader community through whichever channels are accessible to them. These conversations help residents understand more about Wienerberger's operations in their local area and in turn the feedback provided to Wienerberger helps the company to positively contribute to the local community and swiftly address any concerns if they arise.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY Learning to Ring

A new ringer started to learn with us at Ockley a few weeks ago. After a visit up the tower to see the bells and watch one being rung full circle he was first shown how to ring the Backstroke as this is easier to master than the Handstroke.

With the bell already rung up the learner stands in the normal position in front of the rope with the teacher in front, the other side of the rope. He is given the tail end to hold with both hands and told to keep his hands pointing down until the rope pulls them upwards. The teacher pulls the sally and as the bell turns full circle the tail end starts to rise until at the top of its swing the learner's hands are above his head and the rope is taut. He should then pull down in a straight vertical line until the thumbs are pointing downwards, as if throwing the rope down a hole just in front of his feet.

Once this is mastered, the handstroke is introduced in small steps. Eventually the learner is ready to put both hands on the sally while holding the tail end in his left hand. The sally is pulled down straight, this time letting go, at about waist height and immediately putting the right hand on the tail end as well, just above the left, ready for the tail to be pulled up for the backstroke, as above. The tricky part comes at the next handstroke; to catch the sally as it goes up, early enough to check it if necessary and then pull it hard enough to keep the bell's momentum stable.

This sounds guite simple but can take several weeks to accomplish. Bell ringing is fairly unique in that the equipment is not available to practice at home, and it is a team effort. We try to give learners as much one to one tuition on a silenced bell as possible until they are able to handle the rope well enough to ring with the rest of the band. Then the challenge is to strike the bell at the correct time to keep place in rounds. Congratulations to our new learner who had progressed well enough to join in our ringing for the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings on 6th June and get his first entry on Ringing World's Bell Board.

Bellringing is an art which has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years. It is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, friendship, a challenge of wits and skill which gives great satisfaction when it goes right. If you would like to find out more, please come along. 





298 GIRAFFES

Did you know, the average weight of an adult giraffe is around one tonne? Now try to imagine 298 giraffes standing together. Why is this relevant? Last year, a staggering 298 tonnes of recyclable material had to be rejected for recycling. The recyclable material had been contaminated by unrecyclable items that prevented it from being made into something else.

This is a massive issue because rejected loads and contamination of dry mixed recycling is expensive for local councils to sort out – and that extra cost is passed on to councils and the taxpayer. It's widely recognised that recycling guidance can be confusing, though, and putting the wrong thing in the recycling is easily done. The good news is you can follow these five steps to help make it a little easier.

- Some items look recyclable but aren't. Recycling instructions on packaging can be misleading. Check first by using the Surrey Recycles search tool or downloading it as a free app.
- Check what you can recycle separately. In most areas of Surrey, food waste and garden waste, small electricals, batteries and textiles recycling are collected separately - they don't go in your recycling bin. Use our recycling search tool or free Surrey Recycles app to check how to recycle them.
- No food or drink. Residue such as moisture and grease will ruin cardboard and paper and make it unrecyclable. Give food and drink packaging a quick rinse by dunking it into soaking pans before placing in your recycling bin.
- Place all items loose in your recycling bin nothing inside bags, sacks or bin liners please.
- Play to bin try our drag and drop waste sorting game today!

SEP Officer Chair, Nick Steevens, says: "In Surrey lots of people are recycling which is great. But rates have plateaued in recent years, so we need to be looking at areas for improvement. Recycling contamination is a serious and costly issue that's bad for public finances, the taxpayer, and ultimately, the environment. We eagerly await the Government's Simpler Recycling reforms which should help everyone. In the meantime, following these five easy steps will help us reduce that damage and I'd urge you to try the Surrey Recycles search tool or download the free app today."

DANCE FITNESS CLASSES IN CAPEL VILLAGE HALL

If you fancy more variation of dance styles while keeping fit, then the Thursday evening class might be of interest. The fitness routines incorporate Latin and ballroom steps such as Cha cha, Jive, Tango, Waltz, Charleston, to name but a few and are suitable for all abilities. This is an upbeat class guaranteed to increase your heart rate and burn calories and takes place at a time late enough to come after work, but early enough to enable you to have an evening with friends or family.





MEMORIAL WINDOW IN ST MARGARET'S

A new Memorial Window has been installed in the north aisle of St. Margaret's next to the new exit door, designed by Amanda Blair of Abinger Stained Glass and installed by John Mahoney of Horsham.

The design is modern in vibrant colours in contrast to the other rather dark Victorian windows. It features a dominant cross, a dove at the top, a biblical quotation, 'I am the Resurrection and the Life' and a pastoral view, with a miniature Leith Hill tower at the top of the hill.

The initial design included Jayes and Elderslie and farm animals but was deemed too fussy. The window is in memory of Charles and Patience Lee Steere and John and Joan Prideaux, my parents and my uncle and aunt.

Charles was born and educated in Australia before going to Christ Church, Oxford. He inherited the Jayes estate because his second cousin, John, had been killed early in the First World War. John is commemorated in the chancel but is buried near Ypres in Belgium. John's parents, Harry and Anna, are commemorated by the choir stalls and his grandparents, Henry and Elizabeth, and his great grandparents Lee and Ann, in the other stained glass window in the north aisle. They are all buried in the family tomb at St Margaret's.

Charles served in the RAF and was killed flying over Belgium on 27th May 1940 and is buried there.

Patience Lee Steere née Hargreaves Brown was brought up at Broome Hall in Coldharbour and married my father on 15th February 1939 at St. Margaret's and lived most of her life at Jayes. She is buried in the family tomb.

John Prideaux inherited Elderslie from his mother, Marion Arbuthnot, who married his father, Walter Prideaux, in 1901. His great-grandparents, George and Maria Arbuthnot and great-great grandparents, George (who bought Elderslie in 1824) and Elizabeth are commemorated on plaques in the south wall of the nave. He and Joan, my mother's sister, lived at Jayes before moving to Elderslie. They married in St Michael's, Chester Square, in London and are buried in the St John's graveyard. John was on the Parochial Church Council (and the Parish Council) for many years as well as having a successful career as a banker in London.

Elizabeth Lee Steere 's parents had rented Elderslie in the 1840s and she met Henry and carved their initials on a windowpane inside a heart!

There is a family story that the Arbuthnots, Calverts and Lee Steeres dined together almost weekly, and on one occasion the coach overturned going home because the coachman had over imbibed, so after that they dined and stayed the night, though they only lived a couple of miles apart.

THE GARDEN IN JULY AND AUGUST

So far this year we seem to have had more than our fair share of rain. We

also seem to have had cold winds more than usual which has slowed everything down. Consequently many of our favourite plants such as the colourfully exuberant lupins, delphiniums, clematis, peonies, alliums, geraniums have been a bit later in showing. Now in July and August the mid summer plants take centre stage. Plants such as achillea, echinacea, verbena bonariensis, echinops, scabious, leucanthemum, fuchsia and of course, the wonderful varieties of phlox, later flowering clematis and dahlias.



By July many annuals should also be in full bloom with glorious hanging baskets and pots. Be sure to water regularly and give a liquid feed once a week, maybe designate Fridays as feeding Friday. Also keep deadheading to maintain the flowering of annuals such as zinnia, cosmos, antirrhinum and nicotiana. Various 'repeat flowering' roses will continue to bloom through to autumn if they're looked after (and watered!). Keep deadheading and feeding them, particularly if they're in pots. Later-planted sweet peas should still be looking good if you cut them regularly (to stop them setting seed). And this is also the time when pots and hanging baskets give that extra vibrancy to our outside spaces; the bright reds, lipstick pinks, corals and lilacs of pelargonium, begonia and verbena; the blousy petunias; those honey-scented nemesia; and the trailing colourful stems of lobelia, bacopa and fuchsia.

On the vegetable patch make sure you water on a regular basis, particularly your tomatoes, consistently feeding them once a week. Stop cordon tomatoes from growing too high by removing the main shoot. Look for the leaf that's above the fourth truss (set of developing fruit) and cut it off here. This should ensure that all the fruits ripen by the end of the season. Also remove some of the lower leaves, Bush tomatoes can be left to their own devices.

First early Potatoes should be ready to harvest soon along with Spinach, Peas and Beans, Carrots, Salads and spring planted Onion and Garlic. Consider sowing spring cabbage, leeks and brassicas for a winter supply. Summer prune gooseberries and redcurrants.

And finally... the Okewood Ockley and Forest Green Summer Fair is on Saturday 10th August. After a very successful fair last year we are hoping

for a bumper year this year. It is the most popular fair in the area and is well known for the traditional and friendly atmosphere. There's fun for all the family with music and Morris Dancing; Classic Cars; a Kids Zone; and craft demonstrations. Check out the plant stalls and the various vegetable exhibits in the Marquee. You might even be exhibiting your own fruit, veg or flowers yourself. A schedule and entry form should have been delivered to your door in June, and all the details areon the website: www.okewoodhillflowershow.co.uk



ANOTHER TRIUMPH FROM OCKLEY DRAMATIC SOCIETY

Alan Hardy's production of the two act comedy Quizzers by Geoff Bamber closely observes some wonderfully portrayed characters and their relationships with one another.

ODS's production featured a talented team of actors, from husband and wife team Martyn and Katie Peters playing the quiz obsessed husband Keith and his wife Lorna who kept him in place; their daughter Alison and her girlfriend Nic played by Vee Hardy and Chloe Wellman, planning their life together; the artist and well-known danger to women, Ross, played

by Stephen Dallyn; Binny, a wacky London designer so well inhabited by Wendy Freeman; Stella, Nic's mum who has had so many husbands she's not sure exactly how many, portrayed by Tracey Hardy and Gary Herring playing an ex-con who managed to portray his character Rat as someone both in control through meditation and yet totally unpredictable.

So how did they do? This was the best of am-dram with convincing characters and stage presence, wonderful ad-libbing, and some great comedy moments – mostly intended! Stella's lovey-dovey phone message for her not yet divorced husband, was delivered with suitable insincerity. Keith's continually stressing to get 'in the zone' for the quiz reminded me of real people I have actually met, and Lorna's escape to find sanity in her 'temperature-controlled cultivation environment' was portrayed with generosity as she put up with her husband's quiz obsession. Delightfully, art met reality when she referred to Keith by his real name – but she handled it well! Alison and Nic were convincing as a couple planning their life together – focussing on the central place of their washing machine in their relationship. Binny was clearly delighted to fall for Ross's 'input' as he played the all too convincing roué, while Rat's portrayal of the ex-con was worryingly lifelike and seemed to suggest that the rest of the characters were naïve to trust him.

Mention should be made of the scenery and costumes: Keith's study was wonderfully un-cared for as befits a man who is no longer interested in his career and has become absorbed in quizzes to the exclusion of everything else. Each of the costumes enhanced the personality of the person they were playing. I wondered if there was a thing going on with shoes in the production: Binny and Stella were wearing red ones (you know the saying!) and Ross's multi-coloured footwear outshining even his dramatic stripy jacket!

UPDATE FROM WIENERBERGER EWHURST BRICK AND TILEWORKS COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE

The recent community liaison committee (CLC) held on 6th June 2024 was attended by representatives from Surrey County Council, Ockley Parish Council, Abinger Parish Council, Ewhurst Parish Council, Okewood Hill Residents Association and company representatives from Wienerberger.

The Works Manager was happy to report that following an extended maintenance shutdown, the factory restarted on 1st May 2024. Production of bricks is slowly ramping up to capacity, when recent investments in new robotics and a kiln refurbishment should benefit production.

This follows several production challenges over the past 9 months, including a breakdown of the scrubber which failed 6 weeks prior to the factory shut down for maintenance in November. The scrubber is a piece of equipment that removes emissions from the kiln exhaust which is vented high to atmosphere via a chimney stack for dilution and dispersal. Over 200 tonnes of solidified limestone were removed from the scrubber as part of the repair

process. Now that repairs are complete and the scrubber is operational, a stack emissions test is planned for early July to confirm that the factory is compliant with the permit conditions for emissions to atmosphere. Mole Valley District Council has been kept up to date about the breakdown and schedule to return to normal operating conditions.

Wienerberger is keen to reduce its contribution to climate change and has already installed solar panels on the roof of its Visitor Centre. The company is now exploring the option to install ground mounted solar panels in its field behind the factory. The proposed scheme is a 1.4 MW system comprising 4,000 solar panels which could supply up to a quarter of the factory's electricity demand per year. This is well shielded by woodland and would only be visible from a footpath which runs along the site boundary. This will require planning approval and Wienerberger expects to submit a planning application to Surrey County Council later in 2024.

The factory continues to support local community groups and has recently supported visits for archaeologists, palaeontologists, Horsham Geological Society, as well as providing a training venue for the emergency services. Wienerberger continues to sponsor the children's classes at the Okewood, Ockley and Forest Green Flower Show. The factory will again hold a Heritage Open Day on 7th September 2024, please visit www.heritageopendays.org.uk to book your ticket.

Ewhurst brick and tileworks Community Liaison Committee (CLC) is a gathering of residents, councillors, council regulators and staff at Wienerberger. Members come together three times per year to discuss the interaction of the Ewhurst brick and tileworks operations with the local community. The discussions span a variety of issues and can include everything from supporting community groups and local events, to environmental monitoring and HGV traffic management in and around the factory. Members can recommend topics for the agenda according to their interests.

In between the CLC meetings, members are encouraged to share points of interest with their neighbours and the broader community through whichever channels are accessible to them. These conversations help residents understand more about Wienerberger's operations in their local area and in turn the feedback provided to Wienerberger helps the company to positively contribute to the local community and swiftly address any concerns if they arise.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY Learning to Ring

A new ringer started to learn with us at Ockley a few weeks ago. After a visit up the tower to see the bells and watch one being rung full circle he was first shown how to ring the Backstroke as this is easier to master than the Handstroke.

With the bell already rung up the learner stands in the normal position in front of the rope with the teacher in front, the other side of the rope. He is given the tail end to hold with both hands and told to keep his hands pointing down until the rope pulls them upwards. The teacher pulls the sally and as the bell turns full circle the tail end starts to rise until at the top of its swing the learner's hands are above his head and the rope is taut. He should then pull down in a straight vertical line until the thumbs are pointing downwards, as if throwing the rope down a hole just in front of his feet.

Once this is mastered, the handstroke is introduced in small steps. Eventually the learner is ready to put both hands on the sally while holding the tail end in his left hand. The sally is pulled down straight, this time letting go, at about waist height and immediately putting the right hand on the tail end as well, just above the left, ready for the tail to be pulled up for the backstroke, as above. The tricky part comes at the next handstroke; to catch the sally as it goes up, early enough to check it if necessary and then pull it hard enough to keep the bell's momentum stable.

This sounds guite simple but can take several weeks to accomplish. Bell ringing is fairly unique in that the equipment is not available to practice at home, and it is a team effort. We try to give learners as much one to one tuition on a silenced bell as possible until they are able to handle the rope well enough to ring with the rest of the band. Then the challenge is to strike the bell at the correct time to keep place in rounds. Congratulations to our new learner who had progressed well enough to join in our ringing for the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings on 6th June and get his first entry on Ringing World's Bell Board.

Bellringing is an art which has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years. It is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, friendship, a challenge of wits and skill which gives great satisfaction when it goes right. If you would like to find out more, please come along. Practice nights are at St. Margaret's, Ockley, on Wednesdays from 7.45 to 9.15, apart from 1st Wednesdays when we visit St John's in Capel.







Recycling makes financial sense for councils as it is cheaper than disposing of waste as rubbish and leaves more cash available for other essential services. It also generates less carbon dioxide than rubbish disposal, so it has additional environmental benefits.

It's widely recognised that recycling guidance can be confusing, though, and putting the wrong thing in the recycling is easily done. The good news is you can follow these five steps to help make it a little easier.

- Some items look recyclable but aren't. Recycling instructions on packaging can be misleading. Check first by using the Surrey Recycles search tool or downloading it as a free app.
- Check what you can recycle separately. In most areas of Surrey, food waste and garden waste, small electricals, batteries and textiles recycling are collected separately - they don't go in your recycling bin. Use our recycling search tool or free Surrey Recycles app to check how to recycle them.
- No food or drink. Residue such as moisture and grease will ruin cardboard and paper and make it unrecyclable. Give food and drink packaging a quick rinse by dunking it into soaking pans before placing in your recycling bin.
- Place all items loose in your recycling bin nothing inside bags, sacks or bin liners please.
- Play to bin try our drag and drop waste sorting game today!

SEP Officer Chair, Nick Steevens, says: "In Surrey lots of people are recycling which is great. But rates have plateaued in recent years, so we need to be looking at areas for improvement. Recycling contamination is a serious and costly issue that's bad for public finances, the taxpayer, and ultimately, the environment. We eagerly await the Government's Simpler Recycling reforms which should help everyone. In the meantime, following these five easy steps will help us reduce that damage and I'd urge you to try the Surrey Recycles search tool or download the free app today."

DANCE FITNESS CLASSES IN CAPEL VILLAGE HALL

There is a lot of evidence proving that exercise to music offer many benefits, and keeps our minds and bodies fit and healthy.

If you fancy more variation of dance styles while keeping fit, then the Thursday evening class might be of interest. The fitness routines incorporate Latin and ballroom steps such as Cha cha, Jive, Tango, Waltz, Charleston, to name but a few and are suitable for all abilities. This is an upbeat class guaranteed to increase your heart rate and burn calories and takes place at a time late enough to come after work, but early enough to enable you to have an evening with friends or family.
