OKEWOOD HILL, OCKLEY & FOREST GREEN SUMMER SHOW

The date for this year's Summer Show is August 10th. I know it is an early reminder, but you know how fast the months flash past. So, put the date in your diaries!

The Committee is at full tilt, and we have already booked several stallholders and attractions. Nothing like starting early.

As ever we will pray for good weather, and hope we will be as fortunate as we have in the past few years.

THE GARDEN IN EARLY SPRING

As we write this (in early February with snow still on the ground) it's hard to believe that by the time you read it the transformation that is Spring will be underway – slowly at first then gathering pace as full-on April arrives. Hopefully, there will already be Crocus, Muscari, Scilla, Chionodoxa and, a bit later, the lovely Snakeshead Fritillary to cheer us up. The vivid stems of Cornus Midwinter Fire and its sisters will be at their vibrant best, and two fragrant shrubs, Sarcococca and Daphne Odora, will still be performing. As April arrives, the frogs will be croaking as they are a-wooing and one morning a mass of frogspawn will suddenly appear in the pond. And the lawn will need cutting (give it a 'Weed & Feed' after its stressful 2018).

Prepare. The winter planning of the vegetable plot can now be started by preparing the beds by turning over the top soil and work in the well rotted manure and compost where appropriate. Do not fertilise beds that are intended for root crops such as carrots and parsnips but the addition of sand will encourage deeper growth. The addition of lime will help the cabbage bed and also the beans and peas. Give a good covering of mulch to raspberries and blueberries. Early and maincrop potatoes should be chitted ready to plant out in early April. In April prepare bean trenches and supports and also pea supports reading for planting in May.

Prune Wisteria (better late than never); take shrub and English Roses back by a third and remove all dead wood, and give HT roses a much tougher prune. Cornus also needs to be cut back really hard at the end of March to promote the brightest new stems for next Winter.

Plant lily bulbs and other summer bulbs; early potatoes should be planted out in late March and main crop about two to three weeks later; onions, shallots and garlic can also be planted in March and April.

Propagate annuals from seed (make sure half-hardy varieties are protected from frost). Despite what the books say, we find most seeds are best started in pots or trays, even though the packet often says you can sow them directly in soil. (OK, a few don't really like being transplanted....). We've found Cosmos Sensation and Lavatera to be easy and reliable. Or (again, being conscious of frost) buy plug plants and grow them on if you have the facilities.

March is a good time to divide established perennial plants before they are in active growth. Wait for a day when the soil is dry enough to work and dig up the plant with a fork. Then split the plant into smaller parts using a knife or for large clumping plants use a spade. Make sure the new plants are replanted as soon as possible, preferably in the same soil or in pots. Make sure they are well watered until established.

Plants of the Season

Early: Auricula (a velvety, intricate and dramatic Edwardian favourite); Narcissus 'Thalia' (striking ice-white)

Later: Magnolia soulangeana (blousy and beautiful); Hosta variegata, with new spring growth so fresh you want to eat it (no, seriously, DON'T!) Slugs feel the same, so protect! Alchemilla Mollis (water droplets sit on its leaves like pearls).





NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Called Changes

Once a new ringer is able to handle a bell it is time to start ringing with the rest of the band. Initially they will ring 'rounds' where the bells sound in a descending scale from the treble to the



tenor. It takes practice to get the bell to strike in the right place, so that the gaps between each bell sound evenly spaced.

By altering the handling the rate of swing of each bell can be varied, within limits, so that a pair of bells can change place and thus vary the tune. For example the conductor may call 3 to 1 so that the order of the bells becomes 1-3-2-4-5-6. Three bells are affected by a call, one rings slower, one quicker and the third stays in the same place but following a different bell. In this case, the 2 has to pull harder to hold the bell up a bit longer, the 3 has to check his pull to bring the bell down quicker and the 4 rings at the same speed but following the 2 instead of the 3.

Further calls are made to continue changing the order of the bells with the aim of eventually bringing them back to rounds. At the end the conductor calls 'Stand' indicating all the bells should set at the next handstroke, so that they all stop together.

Anyone who would like to come along and have a go, under supervision, or just to watch, would be most welcome. Practice nights are at St. Margaret's in Ockley, on the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Wednesday of each month from 7.45 to 9.15, and at St John's in Capel on the 2^{nd} , 4^{th} and 5^{th} weeks.

ABINGER PARISH COUNCIL - ELECTIONS

It's election year in local government and Abinger Parish Council is keen to encourage potential new candidates to come forward.

There will be nine vacant seats (five in the north ward and four in the south ward) and not all the nine current Councillors will be standing again. If those who are standing, and those new candidates, don't number more than nine then no election will be held and instead they will be co-opted onto the Parish Council.

To stand as a Parish Councillor you must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union
- Meet at least one of the following four qualifications: (a) You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish/community in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards; (b) You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish/community area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election; (c) Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish/community area; (d) You have lived in the parish/community area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

Those thinking of standing can learn more about what is entailed by reading an article posted on the Abinger Parish Council website by Carla Jones, one of the newest Councillors, who has explained about life at this level of local government. Election day is Thursday 2nd May and nominations open on Monday 25th March – closing on Wednesday 3rd April.

Mole Valley District Council, which administers the election process, is holding a prospective candidates evening on Monday 25th February and will provide nomination packs to Parish Councils. As teachers, our primary focus is on children's learning, and it is with this in mind that we venture each week into our designated area in the woods. Research has shown that children learn best through play-based experiences: play is a vital part of child development as it enables children to take risks, solve problems and explore and experience learning in a purposeful and meaningful way. 




