OCKLEY FAMILY TREE

On moving to Ockley from Woodmansterne in 1975 I was aware that my wife, Lyn, had some local connections. Her grandfather took over the tenancy of Mill Farm in the 1940s and she went to Ockley school in the 1950s.

As a hobby I took up genealogy to trace my family history. It came as no little surprise to find that I had a much greater connection than I could initially believe. It turns out that my 12th great grandfather was a local man. His son John Steere was born in Ockley in 1616. The family tree on the following page shows the direct descendants to the current day.

In 1616 King James was on the throne of England and Scotland. Sir Walter Raleigh had just been released from the Tower of London to mount an expedition to find the fabled gold city of El Dorado.

The other more important local event was the birth in 1616 (probably at Jayes) of Nicholas Culpeper, the famed herbalist. His father was the local reverend and Lord of Ockley Manor. Nicholas published his seminal work, Culpepers Herbal, in 1653. He was a very unlucky man as he was disinherited, lost his fiancé to a lighting strike, lost 6 of his children before he succumbed to injuries received in the civil war, dying in 1654.

There were many Steeres in the locality at the time and another John b 1634 took a party from the area to Rhode Island in the late 1650s. The current Lee Steere's ancestors moved to Jayes Park in 1784.

In 1616 Ockley was clustered around St Margarets. Apart from the three big estates of Ockley Court, Eversheds and Jayes and a few farms the rest of the population were agricultural workers and domestic staff. Most of my ancestors were farm workers and domestics until my grandfather, Albert Bishop, came back from WW1 and became an omnibus driver in London. In 1616 the workers lived in very primitive wooden houses without glass windows or brick chimneys. They would have tallow candles but mainly were in bed by dark and up at dawn. Universal education did not come until the 1870s which is why the names Dudney/Dewdney are interchangeable(see family tree).

The average life expectancy was only 22 but if you lived to that age you were probably good for 50 plus. However John lived until he was 83. Most people would not have many teeth past their 20s and any broken bones would lead to deformity,

Transportation was very limited. The old Roman road was disused and most of the flints dug up and used for other purposes. The road (or track) to Dorking was over the hill via Coldharbour to avoid the wealden clay. All the locals had to spend 4 days a year using their own tools to repair

what roads there were. It was not until 1750 when the turnpike connecting Dorking and Horsham was built. The tolls were abandoned with the coming of the railway in the 1850s.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Romance in the Belfry

It is not uncommon for couples and families to ring together. Sometimes there are generations of ringers and it is natural for the children to follow in their



parents' footsteps. These tend to be the best ringers as the art is instilled in them from an early age. Others may have started ringing as a hobby and then bring in their partner or other family members because of the interest they have generated as ringing is highly addictive.

Multiple ringers in a household are very useful for a tower as it is easier to complete a band although their absence is also more noticeable, such as at holiday times. When we were able to ring between lockdowns it also enabled us to ring more bells than otherwise as same household ringers did not need to be distanced.

Last October while we were still able to ring under restrictions, there was an unofficial 'practice' session at Ockley on a Saturday afternoon just for the 15 minutes allowed, with only 5 of the 6 bells taken due to distancing. This was a ruse to allow one of the ringers to spring a surprise proposal to his long term partner, with just 6 of us there to celebrate and a bottle of fizz tucked away with glasses in readiness. The wedding is booked to take place at Ockley in June, whatever the restrictions may be. When the creator of 'Fun With Bells' asked for suitable material for the Valentine's edition of a monthly podcast all about bell ringing, this was an obvious choice. Their romantic tale has been retold ready for the February broadcast.

After the daily tolling in November for Prayer Month further restrictions came into force. There has been no ringing since, and will not be until the lockdown is lifted nor is there any information yet on what restrictions will be in place. Presumably it will be some time yet before ringing is anything more than the 15 minutes allowed before, with distancing and masks.

We continue to meet socially in Zoom and use Ringing Room to practice. This is a computer application that enables us to ring together remotely by pressing a key for each bell. There are many additional groups holding virtual meetings, to keep the ringing community connected and up to speed, in recognition of the fact that it could still be another six months before ringing returns to anything like before.

Ringing has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years. It is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, and friendship, as well as a challenge of wits and skill.


LADY LUCY'S DINOSAUR QUEST







SIMNEL CAKE

This cake was originally baked for mothers on Mothering Sunday, in the days when many girls went into service, and that was the one day they were allowed home.

Now Easter wouldn't be complete without a slice of this tasty treat.

Grease and line an 8inch round cake tin

Set oven at 180c/160c fan, 350f, gas mark 5

- 275g/10oz Self Raising Flour
- 50g/2oz Ground Almonds
- 125g/5oz Butter or margarine
- 125g/5oz Caster Sugar
- 450/500g Mixed Dried Fruit
- 1 teaspoon Mixed Spice
- Juice of 1 Lemon
- · 4 medium Eggs, beaten
- 2-3tablespoons Milk
- 450g/1lb Marzipan
- a little Apricot Jam or Marmalade, sieved

Rub butter or margarine into the flour

Stir in sugar, spice, fruit and ground almonds

Mix in beaten eggs, lemon juice and enough milk to make a dropping consistency

Roll out 1/3 of the marzipan to the size of the tin

Put 1/2 the cake mixture into the tin, smooth then put the rolled out marzipan on top and spoon the remaining cake mixture on top and smooth over

Place on middle shelf of the oven and cook for 1 1/4 - 1 1/2 hours until a skewer comes out clean

Cool for 10mins in the tin then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely Remove paper from the cake and turn the right way up Brush the top of the cake with the apricot jam or marmalade

Roll out 1/2 of the remaining marzipan into a circle - use the cake tin to get the correct size

Place the marzipan circle on the top of the cake and pinch up the edges

Place on a baking tray under a hot grill to brown the marzipan

Roll the remaining marzipan into 11 equal balls - the 11 balls represent the disciples without Judas

Stick the balls around the edge of the top of the cake with a little jam.

This is the traditional cake.

My finishing touch:

Mix 6 tablespoons of icing sugar with a little cold water to make a thick paste, add 1 drop of green food colouring, mix well

Spread over the marzipan-not the balls

In a small bowl put 3 tablespoons of GRANULATED SUGAR, add 1 drop of green food colouring, mix well and sprinkle over the icing

Add some mini eggs and chicks

Now enjoy!

INSTANT ICE CREAM

Hi everyone,

I think it's time for a treat, so how about my instant ice cream.

You need;

600ml pot Double or Whipping cream

Frozen soft fruit, or large Banana sliced and frozen

Pour the cream and 2 tablespoons of frozen soft fruit or the Banana in the liquidiser and mix.

Done

Good just as it is or in a sponge cake.

THE GARDEN IN EARLY SPRING

My co-writer of this column, Gary Crouch, sadly died last July and before he passed away, he asked me to carry on writing about gardening for WOOF. So, I am doing as he asked, and I am also adding in some of his ideas and comments from previous years so that his voice continues in this column.

As I write this (in early February with the ground sodden from almost constant rain) it's difficult to visualise that by the time you read it the transformation that is Spring will be underway – slowly at first then gathering pace as full-on April arrives. Even by the end of February, the sun will rise at 7am and set at 6pm. In these continuing Covid times my garden has been my salvation and to witness the garden coming alive again gives new hope for the future. As you read this, there will already be Crocus, Muscari, Scilla, Chindoxia and a plethora of daffodils. The vivid stems of Cornus Midwinter Fire and its sisters will be at their vibrant best, and two fragrant shrubs, Sarcococca and Daphne Odora, will still be performing. As April arrives, the garden will be alive with wildlife with birds and frogs getting together to further their species and soon there will be young mouths to feed.

Prepare. The winter planning of the vegetable plot can now be put into action. My plan, as I write this is to turn the patch of lawn at the front of our house into raised vegetable beds. I intend to grow decorative vegetables such as Rainbow Chard purple French beans, so I will keep you informed of progress. In preparation, all beds benefit from raking over and garden compost or well-rotted manure spread on the top where appropriate. Do not fertilise beds that are intended for root crops such as carrots and parsnips but here, the addition of sand will encourage deeper growth. The addition of lime will help the cabbage bed and also the beans and peas. Also, give a good covering of mulch to raspberries and blueberries. Early and maincrop potatoes should be chitted ready to plant out in early April. In April prepare bean trenches and supports and also pea supports ready for planting in May.

Prune Wisteria (better late than never); take shrub and English Roses back by a third and remove all dead wood, and give HT roses a much tougher prune. Cornus also needs to be cut back really hard at the end of March to promote the brightest new stems for next Winter.

Plant lily bulbs and other summer bulbs; early potatoes should be planted out in late March and main crop about two to three weeks later; onions, shallots and garlic can also be planted in March and April.

Propogate annuals from seed (make sure half-hardy varieties are protected from frost). Despite what the books say, I find most seeds are best started in pots or trays, even though the packet often says you can

sow them directly in soil. (OK, a few don't really like being transplanted....). Cosmos Sensation and Lavatera are easy and reliable and I have sown Marigolds to plant in the vegetable beds to distract pests. March and April is also the time to sow vegetable seeds in pods in a cold greenhouse and also start off Tomato and pepper seeds indoors.

March is a good time to divide established perennial plants before they are in active growth. Wait for a day when the soil is dry enough to work and dig up the plant with a fork. Then split the plant into smaller parts using a knife or for large clumping plants use a spade. Make sure the new plants are replanted as soon as possible, preferably in the same soil or in pots. Make sure they are well watered until established.

Plants of the Season

Early: Auricula (a velvety, intricate and dramatic Edwardian favourite); Narcissus 'Thalia' (striking ice-white)

Later: Magnolia soulangeana (blousy and beautiful); Hosta variegata, with new spring growth so fresh you want to eat it (no, seriously, DON'T!) which the slugs may actually do; and Alchemilla Mollis (water droplets sit on its leaves like pearls).

And Finally

Due to the Covid restriction the Okewood, Ockley, and Forest Green Summer Fair didn't happen in 2020 but we are optimistic that that the 2021 event will go ahead. While writing this, the virus is still affecting large numbers of the population and no-one knows what the next few months will bring. Hopefully things will be clearer by April and at the end of April the committee will make a decision whether or not to go ahead with the 2021 show or not.

Keep gardening and keep safe.







So, how are you getting on? We are reaching the point where some restrictions will be lifted with the good news that infection numbers are going down along with deaths from the virus. That, as well as the excellent news that the numbers are going up rapidly of those who have been vaccinated. It's been a hard old month hasn't it with all sorts of weather thrown at us for good measure. With the weather in mind I was amused to see that there is now such a thing as Muddy Church! We have had Messy Church, Cafe Church, but now there is Muddy Church too. Very appropriate for those of us who have been sliding about in mud on country walks with or without dogs I thought. Anyway, Muddy Church is all about taking church outside, helping people to connect with their environment and those around them and basically enjoying creation, nature and being together. Just what we like doing in Capel and Ockley isn't it?! If only we could be connecting a bit more I hear you say and is this not just another churchy thing? Well Muddy Church is not just for Church goers but offers a space where everyone can come together regardless of age. Friends can meet up, those alone can walk with others and people are invited to share their questions and lives. CAPEL CHORAL ZOOMS!

About this time last year Capel Choral Society was well into rehearsing the set music for the annual Leith Hill Musical Festival which was scheduled for the April. Two 'Combined' rehearsals with the other choirs with whom we would be singing Mozart's Mass in C minor in the Dorking Halls, had gone well under the direction of Festival Conductor Jonathan Willcocks.

We'd all heard about this mysterious virus which had appeared in far-off China, and which had apparently also turned up on a cruise ship in Japan - Spain and Italy had cases as well. There had been ominous mention of one or two cases in the UK, but these things come and go, and it wouldn't affect our daily lives and activities, would it?

Capel Choral held what turned out to be its last 'live' rehearsal on Monday 9th March 2020 and we said our farewells at 9.45pm, fully expecting to meet again the following week. How wrong we were! – later that week the first Lockdown was imposed, the world we knew came to a halt, and the words Coronavirus and COVID-19 started appearing in the news and on everyone's lips. As well as being 'confined to barracks', the fact became known that the droplets expelled during breathing, talking – and singing in particular, were responsible for spreading the potentially fatal virus. This at a stroke brought to a halt all forms of communal singing, and the immediate impact on local choirs was the (initial) postponement of the Leith Hill Festival, with plans for a much-revised Festival in the September – things would be back to normal by then, wouldn't they?

Of course, they weren't; the 2020 Festival was duly cancelled completely, with April 2021 being touted as the next one, and the prospect of choral singing any time soon rapidly slipped away, as much more serious concerns began to dominate our lives.

Capel Choral Society is one of the two remaining founding members of the Leith Hill Musical Festival, having been formed in October 1904, and is proud to have sung in almost all Festivals since 1905. It is a small choir in comparison with others in the Festival; we field about 25 singers while others enter at least twice this number. However in the 2019 Festival Competitions, despite our small size, we won the Men's, Ladies', Part Song and Open Classes, and also came second in the Madrigal!. Without being able to meet to sing together, keeping this successful choir engaged and its vocal cords exercised could have been a problem.

In late spring 2020 the word 'Zoom' started appearing on our computers, and this turned out to be an Application which allows visual meetings between large numbers of participants to take place. As the choir

committee had the foresight to discuss the way forward during the pandemic, a meeting by the Zoom medium was proposed. Committee members duly downloaded the relevant 'app' – with varying degrees of success (I hadn't even ventured into 'Skype') – and a meeting was held in late July. Various teething problems were encountered - some had trouble with maintaining the internet link, and others had to work out how to turn on 'Video', and to 'mute' and 'unmute'. New computers were bought by one or two as a result. However, the meeting was sufficiently successful for a similar meeting of the whole choir using Zoom being proposed.

The first Capel Choral Zoom meeting was held on the 3rd August, as a mainly social get together, and a dozen or so members 'attended', including conductor Stuart Longley; it was heart-warming to see each other again and share Lockdown experiences. Stuart produced some short pieces of music to share onscreen, and so we were able to experience singing together for the first time since early March, (albeit with individuals necessarily muted due to the electronic time lag inherent in the Zoom system). Stuart was able to play synthetic instructional performances to guide our singing, and due to his hours of practice and the learning curve he is on, he was able to highlight individual parts to aid note learning -and to give us 'our note' on his keyboard!

Zoom rehearsals have now become a regular Monday evening event. Stuart has gradually added more music for us to tackle – before Christmas this included the well-known Vivaldi Gloria, and choruses from Handel's Messiah. They were chosen with a view to giving a public concert including these works, if and when suitable relaxations in the pandemic restrictions allowed.

Before Christmas the Leith Hill Festival organisation also got in on the act, holding a Carol 'Zoomfest' in December, hosted by the Festival conductor – about 160 singers took part, and sang a number of favourite Christmas Carols.

'Zoom' singing takes some getting used to – on one hand the singer is trying to follow the beat of the synthetic performance of the piece, at the same time being very aware of your own voice and not those of surrounding singers. It does have one big advantage however – being able to make mistakes without fear of disturbing fellow singers, or receiving a meaningful glance from the conductor! It also means that one doesn't have to rouse oneself from a comfy armchair on a cold wet evening and travel to the rehearsal venue – and if away from home participation is still possible!

With the arrival of the New Year and tragically a seemingly unstoppable third wave of the pandemic, the Festival choirs came to the sad collective decision that it would not be possible to hold a 2021 Festival, since choirs would not be able to rehearse the music. The next Leith Hill Festival will therefore not be held until April 2022, the first time since WW2 that the

Festival has not been held – however, even during wartime a choir was formed from available singers, and concerts given.

As a result, Capel has continued to choose its own music to rehearse, as opposed to the set works for the Festival. At the suggestion of conductor Stuart, the Choir has been learning the Requiem by Gabriel Fauré, with a view to a concert performance when the situation allows.

The number of singers taking part in Zoom rehearsals has gradually grown, some joining from neighbouring Beare Green & Newdigate Choral Society, and some former Capel singers have returned. Any others who would like to join us will be very welcome.

The Leith Hill Festival is also keeping singers engaged by holding some talks by Zoom, one by Festival Conductor Jonathan Willcocks on the J S Bach St Matthew Passion (with some opportunity to sing along with recordings), and one by the LHMF President (and former conductor) Brian Kay.

Hopefully these efforts by choirs and Festival by means of Zoom will stand us in good stead when we are once again able to gather together in the 'physical world' and take part in one of the most enjoyable and satisfying leisure activities that is choral singing.

1. Switch on the defibrillator


 Remove or cut through clothing and wipe away sweat from the chest if necessary
