



NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Bats in the Belfry?

Bell ringers are often asked if they have bats in the belfry, not always in jest, and the answer is often affirmative. The towers have openings in the walls



around the bells for ventilation and for the sound of the bells to be heard. There are louvres to keep out the worst of the weather and restrict access to wildlife. The bell chamber therefore provides a secluded area sheltered from the elements perfect for bats to roost in or, more problematically, birds to nest in, which can cause quite a mess. It is also a popular place for hibernating insects.

A few years ago when ringing in the summer at St John's, Capel we had an angry visit from a large number of wasps. They had built their nest against the bell frame and the movement of the bells had disturbed them. They flew down the rope holes and stung several people in the short time it took to stand the bells and evacuate the tower.

Thankfully this type of visitation is usually more pleasant, normally butterflies, ladybirds or such. Woken by the moving bells they follow the ropes down to the light and relative warmth of the ringing room and flutter about. We often see red admirals, peacocks and tortoiseshells but this year we have had a lot more ladybirds.

Every autumn dark patches appear on the walls around the ringing chambers which on closer inspection are found to be clusters of ladybirds. Due to the mild winter this year a large number have survived and in the warm early spring they started flying around the ringing chamber during practices, landing on the clothes and hair of unsuspecting ringers, sometimes hitting quite hard. Carrying on ringing during such a distraction can be quite challenging.

Ringing is well within the capabilities of most people. Being able to count is all the maths needed and you can become a very good ringer knowing nothing about music. Anyone who would like to come along and have a go, under supervision, or just to watch, would be most welcome. Practice nights are at St. Margaret's in Ockley, on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month from 7.45 to 9.15, and at St John's in Capel on the 2nd, 4th and 5th weeks

WHAT HAPPENED TO OCKLEY?

When we first moved to Ockley almost 40 years ago, it was as close to the perfect village as one could hope to find. The couple who sold us their house held a farewell party and thoughtfully invited us so that we could meet some of the villagers. On the day we moved in, our neighbours very kindly popped over with some sandwiches and a bottle of wine as they correctly surmised that we would be too weary to cook for ourselves. Over the following weeks we were invited by numerous neighbours for a drink or a meal and we found a very welcome and friendly village with a wonderful sense of community, even the village policeman, who used to ride around on his horse would drop in on newcomers, find out there interests and ensure that they met other like-minded people in the village.

When we started our family, neighbours children were keen to babysit and there was always someone to turn to for advice. We had the most wonderful school that bound the community together, the rose queen festival always attracted the older members of the village, there were the packages of food at harvest thanks giving which were delivered to the senior citizens by the children themselves and one of my fondest memories was of the children being taken to local farms to collect milk and wheat from which they made bread and butter and learned to understand where their food came from. They also went on a nature walk and collected blackberries and each person who attended the harvest thanksgiving service at the school was given a little piece of bread, butter and blackberry jam made by their child. This kind of education seemed to be far more important than whether or not they could pass tests but the children also excelled academically in the caring environment.

I recall hearing a social worker saying that Ockley did not need social workers because when someone required help the whole village rallied round to help. I encountered this at first hand when my husband was taken seriously ill whilst travelling abroad. I flew out immediately to be with him and Ockley friends and neighbours immediately stepped in to care for our children and dogs and continued to do so for the 8 weeks we were away, supporting members of my family who flew in to help and making them feel welcome as well.

Some of our older friends were surprised when they were poorly, to have a knock on the door at mealtimes and the landlords of both the Old School House and The Cricketers would send out plates of hot food when they heard someone living alone was unwell.

We are not regular church goers but always went to hear the last post being played at Oakwood Hill church on Remembrance Sunday. The church was also a wonderful place for quiet contemplation and at some crisis points in my life I received great love and kindness from some of the lovely members of what was then a vibrant church community and knowing that prayers were being said in church for my husband gave me great comfort.

For a few years work took over my life and I came out of my office to find that the Ockley I knew and loved had gone. I feel for the church goers whose parish has been split and who because of these changes and the problems it created struggle with their faith, my heart bleeds for the young parents who no longer have an excellent nurturing school or nursery in the village, for the older folk who have problems to get to the doctor or post office, for the youths who play football and cricket because their clubs are struggling.

I have huge admiration and respect for those who are trying to keep the spirit of the village alive, The Ockley Society, TLC, the ladies who run the café on a Wednesday, The Dramatic Society and the team who are working so valiantly to restore the local school. They are doing a wonderful job and they need all the help they can get, but time and time again, I hear it is hard to get volunteers. Is there any hope of getting our old Ockley back or has the exodus of original villagers meant that the values they stood by have gone too? Perhaps if we try harder, we will find it again.

If you would like to see a glimmer of the old Ockley, come to the socials on the first Friday of every month and keep our pubs alive, meet your neighbours and plan new events or simply just share your interests, reach out to a neighbour who needs help, support The Ockley Society and the efforts made by the people who care and if by some miracle we were able to get our school going again, perhaps more young families would move in and perhaps we would be deemed vibrant enough to call ourselves a community again or have people and times changed so much that this is wishful thinking?

LETTER FROM REV. LIZ

Writing this month's letter just after we were originally due to leave Europe and as we await the conclusion if any to Brexit negotiations, I am minded to wonder just how the recent weeks and months before that will be seen in the course of time. How will history view these extraordinary times, of a divided nation, parliament and government as well as our prime minister, as our nation seeks to go it alone somewhat? And at the moment, each day brings another twist or turn... This time will pass as all these things do; but what I wonder will be the legacy that is left behind? We will have to wait and see....

Last month we celebrated Easter and I am minded to reflect of how things didn't turn out as the disciples and others wished when the person they thought was going to free them from foreign occupation; someone who could perform extraordinary miracles, was put to death in the cruellest of ways alongside criminals. Where had it all gone wrong they must have wondered? As the people watching on jibed Jesus saying 'He saved others, let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, the chosen one!' no one could really understand or know what would happen next. Then as indeed now, things moved very quickly and I love how Luke's gospel tells of two disciples wearily travelling back from Jerusalem on the road to Emmaus, a nearby village. Despondent they are discussing as you would about all that they had just witnessed in Jerusalem. Jesus who appears as a fellow traveller joins them and hears how their hopes had been dashed; and goes on to explain the scriptures to them. It was only when they were eating with Jesus later that they realised exactly who it was who was sitting eating with them! What had at first appeared to be a hopeless situation; one which appeared certainly to be Godless too, was transformed into something that has and continues to stand the test of time some 2000+ years later; the birth of Christianity. God it seems was with them all the time.

For some leaving the European Union it will be a cause of great celebration but for others it will be a matter of great lament. But now we have to face the future, unknown for many, but we have to resist the temptation to be divided. It will be a new age and we can and should not be defined or define others by how we voted in the referendum. This is only the beginning of a new relationship with Europe and one thing that has always stood the test of time – in my view 'God' – and that is whenever there is death and destruction, there is always resurrection and new life; new chances and opportunities as new ground is dug over, ready to sow new businesses, ideas and jobs. As we travel along our own Emmaus Road as the church now celebrates the Easter season which leads us up to the Festival of Pentecost where we once again celebrate the outpouring of




