Points to note since the last report

 Continuing concerns about the increased number of visitors to the village were discussed at the March meeting. It was noted that all villages in the area share these concerns. Not all visitors to the countryside are aware of 'the rules of visiting the countryside'. Many wander off public footpaths and end up in private gardens.

It is hoped that once paths have been identified and signs put up for circular walks around the village then visitors will keep on the official footpaths. Funding has been received for two kissing gates to be installed to replace two stiles.

Reminders of the Countryside Code have been put up at various points in the village.

Respect other people, protect the natural environment, enjoy the outdoors. Visitors have also been reminded to take their litter home and deal with any dog poo responsibly - putting it in bins specifically for dog poo or taking it home with them.

ST MARGARET'S AMERICAN CONNECTION

Henry Whitfield, who was the Rector of Ockley from 1618, resigned in 1638 during the troubled religious times in the reign of Charles I. The King James bible, the translation into English, had been published but the Book of Common Prayer with services in English wasn't published until 1662. Progress was too slow for Puritans and the civil war was about to start.

In 1639 Whitfield led a party of 25 families in two ships to New England. Some came from Ockley but more from Cranbrook in Kent and its environs, Whitfield's wife's home . While on board they drafted and signed a contract agreeing mutual support. It is the second oldest such contract after that of the Pilgrim Fathers 20 years earlier. It was signed by the head of the families (some with a cross as they couldn't write) but only by those on the larger ship.

After landing at Quinniapiack (now called New Haven), they made their way to what is now Guilford in Connecticut. They bought land off the Native Americans, the Quinniapiack tribe (then called American Indians) for a few trinkets. The Indians thought this a goodwill gesture and the tribal custom was that such agreements were for sharing the land not exclusive ownership which would cause problems in the future. The first house built was for Whitfield and his family, but it was large enough for church services and was built in stone so it could be a place of safety. Though the local tribe was friendly, neighbouring tribes weren't which is possibly why the locals welcomed Whitfield's party to give them protection. The house was said to be a copy of the then Ockley rectory, which was sited by Puttocks Copse, to the East of Stane Street(A29) shortly before the bend south of Ockley where the toll road was constructed in the 1820's. That Rectory has disappeared, but it would have been timber framed.

Whitfield's house in Guilford is now a state museum and holds many records and artefacts from the early history of the town. It was the first stone house built in Connecticut.

The land round Guilford was very fertile, and the inhabitants prospered.

The name Guilford is spelt without the second d, as was Guildford in Surrey at the time, but the name is more likely to have come from a prominent family in Cranbrook or the town of East Guilford in Kent at the mouth of the River Rother which may have looked like the American site.

Whitfield returned to England with one son leaving his wife and the other children behind. He is buried in Winchester Cathedral.

When Oliver Cromwell came to power as Lord Protector, he asked all able men who had emigrated to return to England and many did. However one of the settlers observed that Whitfield was not suited to life in the

wilderness being 57 when he returned to England, while all the other settlers were younger. 'His frail body was not suited to the cold winters or the manual labour'.

There is a wooden board in St Margaret's recording the names of those who signed the Contract and over the years many descendants have visited Ockley. Indeed, two years ago Pastor Mike, who is a descendant of Henry Whitfield joined a service. He is a Congregationalist Minister in New Mexico.





NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Hopes of Ringing Again for Real





dashed by the last lockdown and despite a gradual easing of restrictions there is still little opportunity to ring our bells.

There was a call to toll the tenor at a minute after 12 for the National Day of Reflection on 23rd March to mark the anniversary of the first lockdown and this was done by one ringer at Capel and another at Ockley.

As it happened this coincided with a late decision to allow ringing just for the Easter Sunday service, if the ringers 'considered the risks acceptable' so the opportunity was taken to check the bells and fittings to ensure everything was in order.

At Ockley the ringing area is spacious and well ventilated and the ropes are quite far apart. In fact under the metre plus distancing rule only one rope needs to be left out, either the 3 or the 4 depending on who is ringing the adjacent ropes given that we have more than one ringer in two households. The Easter service ring was still limited to only 15 minutes, and wearing masks and using hand sanitisers. After 5 months it took a while for the rounds to settle into a regular rhythm but with ringing prohibited there has been no opportunity to practice.

There was sadly another call to toll the tenors the following week to mark the passing of the Duke of Edinburgh and this took place half –muffled at both churches at 6pm on the day he died. This was followed by a national request to toll 99 whole pulls, which is hand and backstroke, the next day at noon. The muffle was left on the tenor as it will be needed again to toll for the funeral. In normal times such an occasion would be marked by hundreds of churches ringing peals and quarter peals dedicated to the memory of Prince Philip but unfortunately this is not allowed under the current restrictions though there will no doubt be a number scored virtually.

There is little likelihood of further ringing until the end of this lockdown and even then it will no doubt be restricted till at least the end of June. Hopefully after the next easing in May we will at least have some limited practice time to help us work on our bell skills and perhaps see a benefit from the virtual practices that have continued throughout.

The weekly Zoom practices have kept us together socially, with the use of 'Ringing Room' for virtual ringing.

This computer application passed its first anniversary at the end of March, and has been upgraded with many developments along the way. It is generally recognised that virtual learning will be a useful training tool even when there are no more restrictions as it helps to develop theory and technical aspects without having to deal with a moving rope at the same time.

JAMES LEE STEERE'S VISIT 1898

Sir James Lee Steere emigrated to West Australia in 1859 having married a Catharine Luke from Perth WA. His younger brother Augustus (my great grandfather) had emigrated to Perth in 1854.

James had established a farm in the South of Western Australia on the Blackwood river which he called Jayes. It was mostly pastureland running sheep and cattle of about 20,000 acres. Such grazing properties were called 'stations' in Australia.

He had an eventful career in Western Australia, becoming Speaker of the first Western Australian parliament and being involved in national committees during the creation of the Federation of Australia in 1900.

In 1878 he and his wife and ten children came back to England for a visit. Another child was born in England. They stayed for 16 months and the sea voyage was 4 months each way. They travelled with a cow on the return trip.

He again visited England with his wife and two daughters in 1898. This time the voyage took 4 weeks. He was very disappointed with Ockley and England. His father had died in 1890 and his mother in 1892. His eldest brother lived at Jayes with 6 unmarried daughters and his wife. James described him as an elderly and embittered man.

Ockley presented to him a feeling of strangeness and stagnation. "I visited Ockley where I was born. There were only half a dozen there who knew me, the rest having died, I suppose, for villagers in England do not go away much". The village had not changed much in appearance since his visit in 1878. Only one house had been built in the past 20 years.

His second brother Henry died a few days after James's visit to Ockley and he returned for the funeral where his two other brothers were too ill to attend!

He was disappointed too that there was not much interest in Western Australia or indeed Australia amongst those he met in London! That came with the gold rush in the next century.

But the point for me of his comments is that without progress there is stagnation! Some houses were built in the 20's and 30's extending the village south and along Weare Street. After the 2nd World War, the Council Houses were built and a few developments have taken place since, but the village has lost its shop (in 1960 there were 3), post office and school.

The Parish Council has been working on a Neighbourhood Development plan to build more houses and to maintain and increase the facilities. We do not want returnees in future years to say Ockley has stagnated.



We are writing about the Jayes Park signs that are springing up everywhere. To be honest we are concerned how far this will go.

We were very saddened to see the new signposts on the green recently as they automatically change Ockley from having a charming, picturesque village green that has seen countless village activities over the years, to an area that loses its charm and looks somewhat suburban.

We are also puzzled why lots of plastic / laminated notices have appeared on gates. Not only is this environmentally inconsiderate, but we do not believe that it will make one iota of difference to people who jettison their poo bags all over the place. Most of us walkers adhere strictly to the country code - these signs are another suburban intrusion into our beautiful countryside. They are not in evidence on other local estates such as Wotton, for example.

Why is it necessary now to blight the beauty? Of course we hope there is a very good explanation for all of this, but we honestly cannot see what that could possibly be.

BUSES UPDATE

ESRTP has been running fully-accessible minibus services in Mole Valley District for many years and, despite the Covid-19 situation, most have kept running.

If you have been kind enough to post our details on your parish or village website in the past, please would you update them as soon as possible.

As we will soon come out of lockdown, this seems a timely moment to remind you of the minibus services ESRTP runs, all or some of which may be of value to folks with transport needs in your respective areas:

Mole Valley Buses4U

A public demand-responsive service on which concessionary passes are accepted. At present this service continues in a much-reduced form and primarily runs "shoppers" services for groups in Beare Green, Bookham & Boxhill. Destinations include Horsham, Leatherhead (Tesco) Redhill & Reigate (Morrisons).

Mole Valley Villager Services 22, 50, 433, 522

Timetabled public bus services on which concessionary passes are accepted:

Bus 22 provides return trips from Newdigate/Leigh and the Abinger area to Dorking on Saturdays.

Bus 50 provides return trips from Dorking, Coldharbour and the Ockley/ Forest Green/Walliswood area to Horsham on Tuesdays and Fridays. On Saturdays the service links Leigh & Newdigate to Horsham instead of Dorking & Coldharbour.

Bus 433 provides return trips from the Walliswood/Forest Green/Ockley area via Coldharbour to Dorking, continuing via Brockham & Leigh to Reigate & Redhill on Mondays & Thursdays.

Bus 522 provides return trips from Newdigate, Leigh & Brockham to Dorking on Tuesdays, Wednesdays & Fridays. On Wednesdays, the service also serves the Walliswood/Ockley area and on Fridays, Cudworth.

Bus 623 Timetabled public bus service on which concessionary passes are accepted providing a return trip from Ashtead to Epsom on Fridays.


