NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Review of 2019

As this is the last article of the year we will look back and consider the main events of 2019. We rang for a few weddings and also a few funerals, on



request, open and half-muffled according to the families' wishes. We have had a regular flow of visiting ringers, some on outings from other areas, others in specific practice groups where ringers of similar standards ring together for advancement. There are a number of these types of practices around now to help novice and more advanced ringers progress. Ockley hosted the Guild Striking Competition, won by the Newdigate band and there were six guarter peals rung during the year, all but one at Capel and three were by local ringers, conducted by Alexander.

We have also gained another couple of keen learners who are rapidly catching up with those from the previous year. There is a clear path of progression when learning to ring, with some overlap: first, bell handling such that you can ring independently without a helper standing nearby, then bell control to keep the bell striking in the right place. By the time these skills are mastered the learner should be ringing in rounds and be able to follow simple call changes, and soon after ringing well enough to ring for church services.

It is at this point that ringing becomes more varied as Plain Hunting is introduced as a precursor to ringing methods. In Plain Hunting the working bells all take turns to move from the front to the back; that is from first place to fifth, in a prearranged order. A lot of methods are based around the treble doing this while the other working bells do a variation and so the learner's first experience of ringing methods is to Plain Hunt on the treble. Beyond this stage there are innumerable methods which follow set patterns, with variations called touches and it is up to the individual how far they want to progress.

If you would like to come and watch or have a go you are welcome to join us on a practice night. We meet every Wednesday, 7.45 pm to 9.15 pm, alternating between Ockley; first and third week of each month and Capel; second, fourth and fifth.

Christmas comes earlier every year and it seems too soon to say, but, best wishes to everyone for the festive period. Please note there will not be a practice on Christmas or New Year's Day though there will be ringing for the Christmas Services and for New Year's Eve.

TWO COUNTIES ART & CRAFTS SOCIETY

Demonstration in Mixed Media by Debbie Hinks on Monday 7th October 2019

We were pleased to welcome Debbie back - this time demonstrating a portrait using pastels and watercolour. Debbie has had a very full career in illustrating and has worked with many publishing houses and on most of the big magazines. Later she took up teaching and now runs her own classes in life drawing and painting in Brighton and surrounding areas. She had brought with her some beautiful portraits showing the lovely effects of pastel painting on skin, in colour and monochrome.

Debbie started with a large sheet of black sugar paper and, using white pastel pencil she marked in the outlines of the face of an Afghan wearing a turban. However, for texture, she often uses a Fabriano Tiziano paper which is ideal for pastel work as it has a bit of a tooth. The nose and eyes were marked out with a white pastel pencil (Kohi-Noor Gioconda 12) and a black pastel pencil was used to build up the dark areas of the eyes and outlines around the face and turban. Using the white pastel pencil she picked out the whites of the eyes and a small white dot for the reflection on the pupil. At the top of the paper in a corner she



made a circle of black pastel which she picked up on her little finger and smudged onto the shadowy area of the face, thus softening the effect. She used various shades of black and grey pastel (Toison d'Or 12 soft pastels) to build up the modelling of the face and with a plastic rubber picked out the highlights. Soon a very striking and dramatic head emerged with piercing eyes.

After the break Debbie gave us a quick summary of the rules for drawing the head and face. Starting with an oval, she drew a vertical line to divide the face, then half-way down she drew a horizontal line to fix the position of the eyes, then another horizontal line to halve the distance between the eyes and chin and this marked the position of the end of the nose. The nostrils are always slightly higher than the fleshy end of the nose. The next half positions the mouth. The top of the ear is on the same line as the eye and the bottom of the ear in line with the end of the nose. The distance between the eyes is one eye's width. However there are always variations from the norm and it is important to measure and look carefully at the subject. Drawing from life is therefore a very valuable exercise.



For her second portrait, using the same subject, Debbie launched into colour using Schminke watercolours on a watercolour paper. She started with a loose wash of a mixture of raw umber and burnt sienna for the face then, using a square flat brush, she marked out the face and lines of the turban framing the face, then a mixture of red with a bit of purple for the turban. Debbie put on all the colours freely with no prior drawing. She marked the beard and parts of the moustache with strokes of Paynes Grey. Burnt sienna was used for painting the features. Then, using a smaller flat brush and burnt umber, she put in the darker tones around the eyes. and an opaque white paint for the whites of the eyes. A smaller round brush was used for painting in the

details. The painting was then dried with a hair dryer before the next stage using pastel. This was a white pastel which was then painted with vertical strokes over the moustache and beard.

The final picture was every bit as dramatic as the first black and white drawing but the colour softened it a little and the Afghan gentleman appeared rather more friendly with a twinkle in his eye!

Debbie was sincerely thanked for a very fascinating evening and, no doubt, many more of us will be tempted to get out our pastels.

GATWICK'S BIG ENOUGH

Gatwick Area Conservation Campaign(GACC) announce a major campaign to challenge Gatwick's Master Plan.

Under the banner *Gatwick's Big Enough* community groups around Gatwick have joined forces with GACC to call Gatwick to account over their Master Plan proposals.

The Master Plan proposes to create an airport that is as big as Heathrow is today. An increase in aircraft movements in the next ten years to 390,000 pa (1050 or more per day), passenger numbers to 70.0 mill pa (190,000 or more per day) all of which will bring increased misery to thousands through noise, pollution and impacts on local infrastructure. These plans also bring a massive increase in carbon emissions caused by the additional flights estimated at an increase of almost 1MtCO2(circa 37% increase) per annum by 2050.

The campaign has got off to an early start with challenges to Gatwick's attempts to bypass full scrutiny on its main runway growth plans through use of the Planning Permitted Development processes.

The initial submission to the Planning Inspectorate for Gatwick's Stage Two, the expansion and active use of the emergency/northern runway, has been made and our teams are now in the process of preparing challenges to these proposals.

Chairman, Peter Barclay, commented "Whilst this growth plan may be within the airport's own boundaries the negative impact on communities extends many miles from Gatwick's borders. In a society where there is increasing awareness of the downside of aviation activities our members want us to ensure these developments are properly contained."



LETTER FROM REVD LIZ

As I write we have seen much demonstration about climate change in Westminster and other cities in the UK organised by the group Extinction Rebellion. Many Christians also took part at these protests, one cleric was arrested, but many more were taking part in prayer vigils, singing hymns and telling stories from the parts of the world who had been most damaged by climate change. As part of our recent Harvest celebrations at St Margaret's Ockley and St John the Baptist Capel we chose a theme which was very much about climate change as well. We learned about an African led project called The Great Green Wall and its aim is to grow an 8,000 km natural wonder which will span the length of the Sahel, from Sengal to Djibouti. This is in order to combat desertification that is currently taking place across Africa. By 2030 the Great Green Wall will be the largest living structure on the planet, 3 times the size of the Great Barrier Reef. This means that the desert will recede and the land can be reclaimed for people and future generations to sustainably farm and support themselves which is fantastic. They say that through a combination of effective land management and growing millions of trees this lost land can be reborn! Also The Great Green Wall will provide a vital resource for the whole world, acting as a carbon sink and cool the earth, reversing the effects of climate change. Climate change has been a constant concern for many years now and whatever your view on the complex science of it there is no doubt we will be affected by it at some time. Here at both St Margaret's and St John the Baptist we are trying to do our bit towards living and using our environmental resources more wisely. Both churches are now bronze award holders of Eco Church and currently working towards our silver awards. The Diocese of Guildford is an Eco Diocese and our Bishops of Guildford and Dorking have joined forces with other organisations in declaring a climate emergency and have pledged to follow seven climatecare commitments.

Bishop Andrew and Bishop Jo's climate-care commitments are to switch to a clean energy provider, use cars less – committing to car-share, cycle or walk at least once every week; cut down on meat, especially red meat, grow as much fruit and veg as possible, reuse all plastic bags and avoid disposable products, use heating as sparingly as possible and never to use a tumble dryer and give regularly to charitable organisations that strive to safeguard God's creation. Challenging stuff! Bishop Andrew is encouraging us to follow suit. A word of warning though - please only consider cutting down on heating if you are fit and well!! However, I love that there is something we can still do to reverse the changes that the world in its supposed progress has brought upon our planet. There is something so biblical about the dry arid areas being restored to be able to grow green trees and vegetation, to be able to sustain life and the future. As in this issue of WOOF we begin our winter journey towards the light in the darkness of Advent and the birth of the Christ child at Christmas let us continue to reflect on the pure wonder of creation, give thanks for it and look after it as our Creator God would wish.




